I would like to convey this information to the inquiry regarding my brother Michael's child who passed away.

This information comes from my brother Michael who I personally spoke with this morning and he quite freely gave this information to me to use as I wished.

Michael and his wife Alexandria gave birth to a baby boy on the 12/5/1979 who was 5 and ½ weeks premature, he lived for 7 hours and passed away on the 13/5/79, they were told that he suffered from respiratory distress due to his lungs not being properly formed.


The cause of death listed on his death certificate is respiratory distress syndrome, a copy of which is provided in the attachment.

Fortunately, Michael and Alexandria were blessed with two more children and are now Grandparents.

I only wish to bring this up to dispel any conjecture as to this baby's demise, given the theories that have been advanced during discussions in court.
