Conjoint Professor Edwin Kirk

Professor Edwin Kirk is a clinical geneticist at the NSW Health South Eastern Laboratory Services as well as co-head of the Centre for Clinical Genetics at the Sydney Children's Hospital. He has trained in paediatrics and clinical genetics. Professor Kirk provides a cardiac genetics clinical service, which focuses on adults and children with cardiomyopathies and disorders of cardiac rhythm.

Professor Carola Vinuesa

Professor Vinuesa is an Australian National Health and Medical Research Council Principal Research Fellow, and Professor of Immunology at the Australian National University. She is also the chief scientist at Canberra Clinical Genomics laboratory of which Professor Cook is the medical director. Together with Professor Cook, she is also the co-director of the Centre for Personalised Immunology.

Professor Monique Ryan

Professor Ryan is Honorary Clinical Professor of Paediatric Neurology at the University of Melbourne and Director of the Department of Neurology at The Royal Children's Hospital, Melbourne.

Associate Professor Michael Fahey

Associate Professor Fahey, a paediatric neurologist and clinical geneticist, is head of paediatric neurology at the Victoria Paediatric Rehabilitation Service at Monash Children's Hospital.

Dr Michael Buckley

Dr Michael Buckley is clinical geneticist, genetic pathologist and clinical director of the NSW Health South Eastern Area Laboratory Services at the Prince of Wales Hospital in Sydney. He was previously appointed a staff specialist and head of genetic pathology at that service in 1997 and regraded to senior staff specialist in 2003. He holds a PhD in the field of molecular genetics, obtained in 1991.

Dr Alison Colley

Dr Alison Colley is a clinical director of the Department of Clinical Genetics at South Western Sydney Local Health District. She was a member of the NSW Ministry of Health Genetics Services Advisory Committee from 1991-2016 and since 2016 has been a member of the Clinical Genetics Executive Committee in NSW Ministry of Health Agency for Clinical Innovation. She was involved in progressing the NSW Health Genomics Strategy published in 2017.

Dr Todor Arsov

Dr Todor Arsov is a visiting fellow at the Centre for Personalised Immunology. He holds a PhD in biomedical sciences and a Master of genetic counselling.
